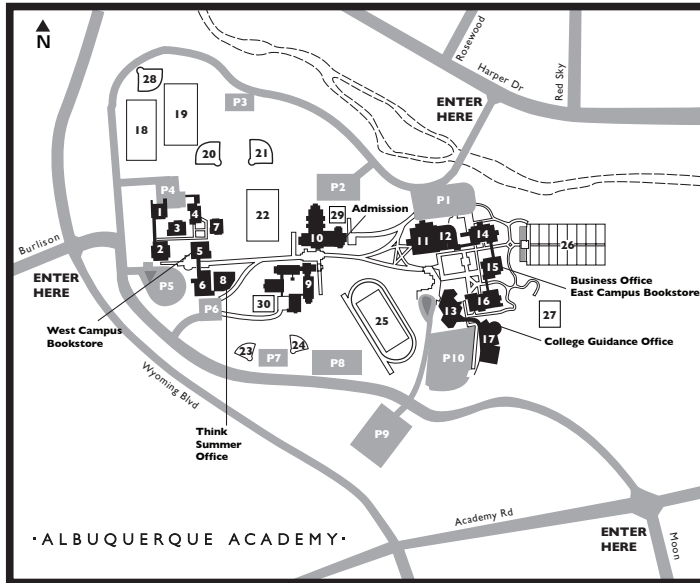


CAMPUS MAP

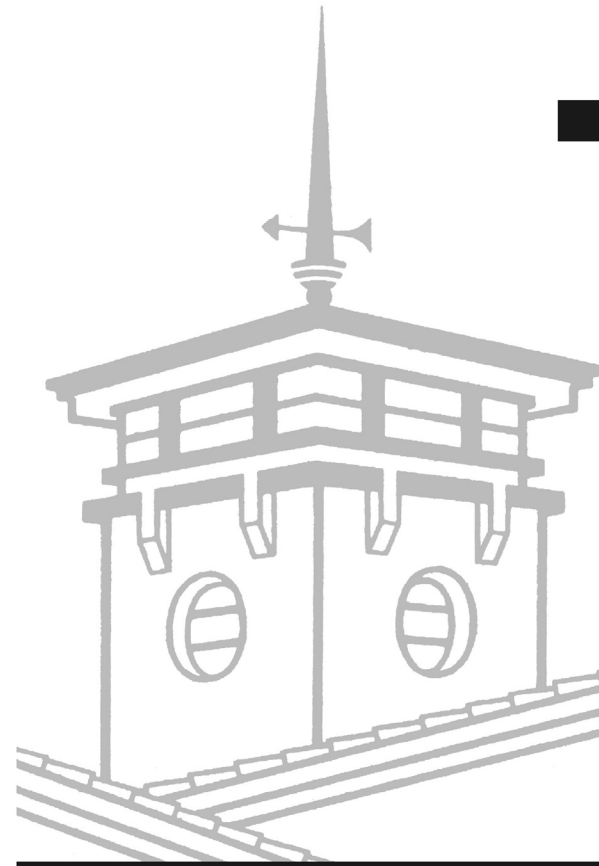

Simms Library Tour

Join us for a walk through the library, visiting the reading rooms, reference area, computer lab, and various study areas. Simms Library, which opened in 1991, has holdings of approximately 150,000 books, periodicals, DVDs, CDs and more. In addition to print items, the library provides access to a variety of online subscription databases and other electronic resources to help students and faculty with research projects. As an Academy grandparent, you are welcome to use the library and check out books with an Academy ID card. Application forms for ID cards are available in the library.

Science Center Tour

Tours of the Science Center, which opened in 1991, will point out many interesting features. For example, located in the center of the lobby is the Foucault Pendulum (first used in the 17th century to provide proof that it is the earth, not the sun, which rotates). Looking up, you will see the nature photos, all taken on the Academy grounds, by staff member Randy Alberts. Next, you will walk by the trophy cases, and note the unprecedented number of championships won by Academy students in the Science Olympiad, the Super Computer Challenge, Science Fairs, and Chess Tournaments. Visit the fish tank in the southwest corner. The classrooms and laboratory rooms are at the back of the building and there is a garden area through the door by the fish tank. The garden is kept in a natural state and used by biology and environmental science classes.

The Desert Oasis Teaching Garden Tour

Join us for an afternoon tour of the Desert Oasis Teaching Gardens. Conceived of in the fall of 2013, the Dot Gardens serve as a community education and experiential learning space where we explore the possibilities and potential for growing food and community in the arid Southwest. Two acres of water intensive turf grass are slowly being converted into water wise, regionally adapted gardens for food production, pollinator habitat, and wildlife foraging. The hub for our environmental clubs and several science classes, the DOT Gardens serve as an exceptional hands-on, outdoor teaching space. Plus, produce from the gardens feeds our community via the campus dining halls. Come see what the buzz is all about!
