

### Online registration opens in February 2024.

# registration: tips & reminders

# More Helpful Tips

- Be sure you review the **Registration Guide** document located on our webpage for more step-by-step instructions.
- Set aside time on registration day to log in as close to the opening time as possible. Due to the high volume of registrants, you may need to wait in the queue for a short time before you're able to register.
- Before you register, review first, second, and third course or camp choices with your child. Some spots sell very quickly, and it's better to have back-up choices prepared just in case.
  - Use the use the **printable scheduling tool** to help stay organized!
- Payment is due in full at the time of registration.

  CampBrain accepts all major credit cards and

  eCheck/ACH.

- Make sure your child's pre-grade level is correct.
  Only options relevant to your child's pre-grade level will appear for you on the registration site.
  If it is entered incorrectly, some of your choices may not be visible.
- Double-check the items in your cart to make sure a class period is not double-booked, and there are no schedule gaps.
- The registration site has a 20-minute inactivity time-out, which could mean the courses in your cart are removed and reopened to the public.
  - **Don't rush!** As long as you are active on the site, you will not be timed-out and your courses will not be removed from your cart. Take your time filling out your child's forms.
- If you add your child to a waitlist, you must also pick an alternative class! We cannot guarantee students on a waitlist will be moved into that camp or class.

#### no-gap policy


- All students must be enrolled in a supervised program or in consecutive classes throughout the time they are on campus. A gap (or an empty class period) in a student's schedule is not permitted.
- Students cannot be dropped off more than 10 minutes before their scheduled camp or course, regardless of age.
- Students cannot be picked up later than 10 minutes after their scheduled camp or course, regardless of age.
- Students may use Simms Library only if they are registered for a class located in the library, or supervised by an adult.
- TAAP staff reserves the right to adjust a student's schedule as necessary so there are no unintended gaps in their schedule.
   Parents will be notified before any required adjustments are made.
   Additional fees may apply.

#### grade-level policy

- To facilitate better teaching and learning, all camps and courses are geared toward specific pre-grade levels. Pre-grade means the grade level your child will be going into in the fall. For example, if your child just finished 4th grade and will be going into 5th grade, they are considered a pre-grade 5 student at Think Summer:
- Students must be enrolled at grade level, i.e., within the grade-level requirement listed in the course description.
- Think Summer follows APS
   age and grade-level guidelines.
   Pre-K children must be 5 years of
   age by August 31 to be eligible to
   register.
- TAAP staff and/or faculty reserves
  the right to adjust a student's
  schedule so that they are enrolled
  in an appropriate course for their
  skill level. Parents will be notified
  prior to finalizing all changes.
  Additional fees may apply.

#### lunch policy

- All students in pre-grades K-3 must be in a supervised lunch group if they are on campus during the lunch period.
- If your pre K-3 student is enrolled in a full-day camp or a P.M. half-day camp, a supervised lunch period is included.
- If your *pre K-3* student is enrolled in individual enrichment courses in the afternoon, they must be enrolled in *Lunch Bunch*. Please see page 52 for more details about *Lunch Bunch*.
- All students who are enrolled in a supervised lunch, regardless of age, shall remain with their assigned lunch group throughout the entire lunch period.
- Lunch is available for purchase (cash only) in the East Campus
  Dining Hall for *only pre-grade 4+*students who are *not* enrolled in a full-day camp or P.M. half-day camp that includes a supervised lunch period. All other students must bring a packed lunch every day.
